

MAYOR'S 2016/2017 VILLAGE BUDGET MESSAGE

Village Board Adopts 0% Tax Increase Budget Under State-Mandated Tax Cap for Fifth Consecutive Year

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I am pleased to present the Fiscal Year 2016/17 Budget of the Village of Westbury.

Due to the Village's fiscal discipline and conservative budgeting practices, this year's budget reflects no increase (0%) in the Village tax levy, once again under the State-mandated tax cap¹.

The 2016/17 budget contains a residential tax rate of .00272 and a commercial tax rate of .00577. Accordingly, the typical Westbury homeowner, owning the average home with an assessed value of \$376,034, will pay, on average, only \$1,023 in 2016/17 for all Village government services. With this budget, the Village continues to maintain among the lowest per capita village property tax levies for comparable villages.

Our 2016/17 budget is the result of a comprehensive review and evaluation of each and every Village department and service, and the critical scrutiny of each and every expenditure line in the budget, as well as many other factors.

Among the most significant factors affecting the 2016/17 budget were:

- State-mandated Village contribution to the New York State retirement system of \$334,381. This reflects a reduction of \$23,684 over last year's contribution amount. However, despite this year-over-year reduction, this line item in our budget has increased approximately 109% over our past 7 budgets.
- Increase by 1.5% in labor costs due to our contract with our CSEA bargaining unit.
- Projected \$10,000 (5.7%) increase in the cost of general liability and workers' compensation insurance premiums.
- Continued savings in fuel and maintenance costs associated with our sanitation operation, due to the successful consolidation of our sanitation routes in late 2014. (As promised, this operational efficiency will save Westbury taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars over the next several years.)

This budget also reflects (i) our continuing commitment to addressing housing enforcement, one of our community's most difficult and important issues; and (ii) increased emphasis on public works projects such as road repair, sidewalk repairs, beautification, tree trimming, etc. Our budget reflects a fully-staffed Public Works department so that we may increase the services provided in these areas. The budget also continues to include funding (\$10,000) for the Westbury Arts Council, which is a reflection of our commitment and goal of making Westbury one of the most arts and culture friendly communities on all of Long Island. We have seen great progress by the Arts Council in its short period of activity, and we are committed to their success.

The budget also reflects that we will continue to pursue our aggressive road resurfacing program, which over the past 7 years has resulted in the repaving of over 21 of our 43 miles of roads (almost half of our roads), as well as the completion of a number of other important capital and infrastructure improvements. It is one of our highest priorities to make our roads as safe and attractive as we can, and we will continue to make progress in these areas in the coming year.

I and the Village Board have taken every step possible to contain costs, while still providing the high level of services that Village residents have come to enjoy and expect, and to deliver those services in the most cost-effective and efficient manner possible. In fact, as noted, this budget provides for enhanced services in our code enforcement, public works and other areas.

To achieve these results, we continue to hold the line on discretionary spending and we have made and continue to seek additional operational efficiencies in all departments. We continue to maintain the highest credit ratings in our Village's history - Aa2 by Moody's (reconfirmed in March 2016) and AA+ by S&P (reconfirmed in May 2016) - reflecting third party acknowledgement of our Village's superior financial condition and fiscal management.

One final note: we take our fiscal responsibilities to our taxpayers very seriously. In the past seven years, we have minimized tax levy increases by applying disciplined financial control, reorganizing our operational departments, controlling discretionary spending, and refinancing our outstanding debt to lower our debt costs - all in light of ever-increasing pressure on municipal governments from rising costs.

While we will continue to employ such similar fiscally-responsible measures, to maintain our ability to run government operations properly and deliver the services our residents deserve and have come to expect, we may in the future need to consider additional revenue enhancements. We want our resident to be mindful of the ever-increasing cost of goods and services, as well as wages, and our limited ability to forestall revenue increases indefinitely.

I believe that the 2016/17 budget is a fair, reasonable and prudent fiscal plan for the Village for the coming year. I hope that you will agree. I and the Board of Trustees are committed to continuing to aggressively work to provide Village services in the most efficient and economical manner possible.

1 For this fiscal year, the Village's tax cap is 0.12% It is important for residents to note that, as a result of fluctuating property values, as reflected in the Village's 2016 assessment roll update, taxes with respect to individual properties may increase or decrease more or less than the 0% increase reflected in the budget.

Pedestrian Safety Improvements

Recognizing that pedestrian safety is important to ALL roadway users, the Village is continuing to implement crosswalk improvements with the installation of mid-street pedestrian crossing signs on Post Avenue. Our intent is to make Westbury a pedestrian-friendly community by improving our crosswalks and making them more visible.

Motorist Tips - YIELD TO PEDESTRIANS - *It's the Law!*

- Watch for pedestrians near the roadway
- STOP** for pedestrians using the crosswalks
- Slow or Stop for pedestrians when turning right or left
- USE CARE** if another car slows/stops for a pedestrian
- Follow all signals, signs and stripes at cross walks
- Know that pedestrians with dark clothes are hard to see at night
- Don't speed or park where pedestrians use cross walks

Steps for Pedestrian Safety

- Before heading out on foot for a stroll, power walk or an errand keep these tips in mind:
- Cross the street in a designated crosswalk or intersection
- Increase your visibility at night by wearing light-colored or retro-reflective clothing or by carrying a flashlight
- It's safest to walk on a sidewalk, but if one is not available, walk on the shoulder and face traffic
- Avoid distractions such as electronic devices that take attention off the road



Working to raise awareness of pedestrian safety the Village continues to implement safety improvements on Post Avenue, including resurfacing/color stamping crosswalks and installing crosswalk signs. There are plans to create additional crosswalks on Post Avenue in the near future.

We are continually working to improve the quality of life in our community and make “stepping out” in Westbury safe for everyone.

MOSQUITO CONTROL in *YOUR YARD*

Mosquito borne virus in the NY area poses risks. The weather has been especially wet. There are many things that can be done in your own yard to help control the mosquitoes. They do not travel far from their breeding sites to feed, so look in your yard and check for stagnant water in: birdbaths (change the water frequently), pots and saucers, pails and flower pots that hold water, and pools (empty kiddie pools and check pool covers), boat and car covers, gutters (keep them clean so water doesn't collect in them), low areas in the ground and anything else that holds stagnant water - even toys. Also, plant marigolds - mosquitoes don't like the smell.

By eliminating breeding spots you will reduce your chances of being bitten.

Mosquitoes are especially active at dusk - stay clear of them.
