

# MAYOR'S 2020/2021 VILLAGE BUDGET MESSAGE

## *Village Board Adopts Budget with 3.0% Tax Levy Increase*

### *Ninth Consecutive Budget Under State Tax Cap*

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I am pleased to present the Fiscal Year 2020/21 Budget of the Village of Westbury.

This year's budget was the most difficult to compile in at least the past decade, due to circumstances beyond the Village Board's control, as outlined below, particularly the unprecedented economic, fiscal and societal uncertainties related to the ongoing Coronavirus public health crisis.

Despite the current significant challenges we face, this budget contains a 3.0% Village tax levy increase, just below the State-mandated tax cap<sup>1</sup>. We have been able to adopt a budget below the tax cap due to our many years of fiscal prudence and conservative budgeting practices, all of which have positioned the Village in its strongest fiscal condition in its history.

The 2020/21 budget contains a residential tax rate of .00224 and a commercial tax rate of .00480. Accordingly, the typical Village homeowner, owning a home with an assessed value of \$484,689, will in 2020/21 pay, on average, only \$1,086 for all Village government services.<sup>2</sup> With this budget, the Village continues to maintain the lowest per capita village property tax levy for comparable villages. The 2020/21 budget is the result of our annual comprehensive review and critical scrutiny of each and every expenditure line in every Village department, as well as other factors. Our fiscal discipline and rigorous review process were especially important in this distressed environment.

Among the most significant factors affecting the 2020/21 budget are:

- Uncertainty as to the impacts on various Village revenue lines, with presumed reductions of receipts in such items as municipal fees, parking fees, building department fees, mortgage and sales tax receipts, etc. In addition, potential cost increases due to current conditions are estimated, and we assume that no federal or state assistance will be provided to mitigate these impacts.
- Increase year over year in sanitation disposal costs, including a 94.1% increase (\$80,000) in recycling and yard waste disposal costs, due to market conditions.
- Scheduled salary increases under the Village's collective bargaining agreement with its unionized employees, and corresponding increases for non-union employees, for an overall increase year over year of \$53,942 (2.17%).

Despite the serious challenges we face, I and the Village Board have taken every step possible to continue to provide all of the essential services that our residents enjoy and expect. The budget includes continued discretionary and necessary public works projects such as road resurfacing and repair, sidewalk repairs, beautification, tree trimming, etc. The budget ensures that Village government and services continue to operate efficiently. We want our resident to be mindful, however, that the unprecedented public health and fiscal crisis that we are experiencing may cause additional fiscal impacts as the year progresses. For example, the State budget this year provides a quarterly status review that may result in mid-year adjustments to the State budget that could have a material adverse impact on certain revenue expectations to the Village, or increase costs to the Village.

I believe that the 2020/21 budget is a fair, reasonable and prudent fiscal plan for the Village for the coming year, given the trying circumstances we are facing. I hope you agree.

The fiscal prudence and conservative budgeting we have exercised in the past has enabled us to build the fiscal reserves and strength needed to fight through this troubled time with mitigated fiscal stress. I and the Board of Trustees are committed to continuing to aggressively work to provide Village services in the most efficient and economical manner possible, and we are committed to making sure that the Village emerges from the current crises strong and intact.

## Tribute to Former Mayor Ernest J Strada

With great sadness the Village of Westbury marks the passing of former Village of Westbury Mayor Ernest J. Strada on April 23<sup>rd</sup>

### Mayor Peter Cavallaro

Mayor Strada was a life-long resident of the Village, and served as our mayor for 28 years. That is a feat that I believe will never be equaled or surpassed. He was my beloved mentor, colleague and friend. His legacy to the community is nothing less than having been the best mayor that the Village has ever had, and in my opinion, will ever have.

Ernie grew up in a house on Post Avenue, in the shadow of St. Brigid Church. How fitting it is that Ernie would grow up near the heart of the Village that he loved. His life was completely about Westbury (and his family), and Westbury was in his blood. He was a graduate of St. Brigid's parochial school and Westbury High School. He attended what is now Farmingdale College. Ernie started out in his family owned plumbing and heating business in Westbury. Because of that, Ernie knew intimately many of the homes in the Village, having done work in them. It was always an amazing history lesson of Westbury to walk in a parade or procession with Ernie as he recalled generations of families who lived in the houses we passed by. Ernie eventually went to work for Nassau County and retired as Director of Construction Services, in the County Department of Public Works.

Ernie was appointed to the Village Zoning Board in 1971 and to the Village Board of Trustees in 1974. He was first elected as Mayor in 1981 and would serve 7 full terms until 2009. As Mayor, he was the strongest advocate that Westbury residents could possibly have had, for so many years and on so many occasions. He possessed a passion and vigor for the community that was unmatched. I had the privilege of serving with Ernie, as a member of the Board of Trustees for 10 years before his retirement.

His accomplishments as Mayor are too numerous to list, but he is perhaps best remembered for his steadfast defense of the Village against the State of New York at the time of the Northern State Parkway widening. The result of that fight was then-Governor Mario Cuomo (our current governor's father), coming to Westbury to sign the settlement agreement in which the Village prevailed. Mayor Strada's efforts in that matter did nothing less than preserve the character of our community. He spent a lifetime of service to Westbury and we owe him a debt of gratitude beyond measure. In addition to his service to the Village, Ernie was recognized as a leader among his peers and was elected to serve both as the President of the Nassau County Village Officials Association, and of the New York State Conference of Mayors.

Ernie was warm, smart, funny, passionate and eloquent, and he was extremely proud of his Italian heritage. His family meant everything to him, and he often spoke of them in the context of relating how the decisions we made are personal and affect our residents and the community.

My heartfelt prayers go out, personally and on behalf of the Village family he loved, to Mrs. Strada and to their surviving children, Susan, Joseph, Michael and Jennifer, his grandchildren and to the entire Strada family.

**Village Justice Thomas Liotti:** Ernie Strada coined the phrase 'Village Family'. He was always part of our family and made everyone in village government feel like they were part of his family. A visionary and patriot, Ernie worked hard to improve our Village and country. Ernie always put God, country and family first.

**1<sup>st</sup> Deputy Mayor and Trustee Steven Corte:** It is with great sadness that we learned of the passing of former Village Mayor, Ernest Strada. While Mayor Strada held the distinction of being the longest serving Mayor in our Villages history, he was much more to our Village and its residents than just having such a long tenure in Village government. Ernie always displayed his love for his family and the community where he grew up by emulating that to us in everything he did. I will always remember Ernie as the person who built the very foundation that our Village is currently using as we move forward with the growth and development that will secure a healthy future for our Village. He has certainly touched the lives of many in our community over the years and, it is because of his many contributions that Westbury is what it is today – A Community of all Seasons.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Deputy Mayor and Trustee Beaumont Jefferson:** Mayor Strada loved Westbury and I will always remember the vivid stories that he would share of his childhood and his life in politics in the village that he loved. He was a giant and will be sorely missed by everyone who knew him.

**Trustee William Wise:** I have known Ernie Strada and had the pleasure of working with him for the betterment of the community for several decades. He appointed me to the Board to fill a vacancy, and his leadership in good times, and in times of challenge, has made Westbury a better place. We will miss him. God bless him and his family.

**Trustee Vincent Abbatiello:** Rest in Peace Ernie Strada "Mr. Westbury", you will be missed by all. Memories of Ernie going above and beyond for the love of the Village and his community, including his personally visiting homes when issues arose, and his always being on the forefront of ever-changing times. Ernie we will miss you and we will continue to make your village shine in your memory.

## COVID-19 UPDATE

While Village government, during this public health crisis, has been operating in a modified manner, due to the Governor's executive orders, we have been doing what we can to maintain essential operations and be poised to return to "normal" once we are able to do so.

Here are some updates on some of the things that we've been doing:

- Modified sanitation schedule - Reverting back to normal sanitation June 1<sup>st</sup>
- Modified recycling schedule - Reverting to regular recycling June 1<sup>st</sup>
- Suspended E-Cycling – Next E-Cycling day to be held July 11<sup>th</sup>
- Limited public meetings and use of teleconference meetings to hold required meetings (Budget, Board etc.)
- DRI and Other Projects – These projects, which are in various stages of progress have been allowed to continue as essential work. We believe that these projects have kept people working and will allow us to continue to complete them without further delay. During this downtime, we have:
  - Started the renovation work at the Community Center, including the Senior Center – expected to be completed before the seniors return
  - Started the renovation of the Westbury Arts building – expected to be completed in the Fall
  - Continued to bid out and finalize plans for streetscape projects
  - Worked with LIRR and 3TC to continue the work on the Third Track Project, including the continuation of the parking garage and School Street grade crossing elimination
- Applied, on behalf of 3 local food kitchens/pantries (St. Brigid; United Methodist Church; and Islamic Center of LI) for federal CDBG-Covid funding to allow them to expand and meet the increased demand for food needs in the community
- Developed a Reopening Plan to return Village operations to normal
- Worked with the Business Improvement District (BID) to promote the businesses that have stayed open due to the shut-down
- Worked with the BID to provide information and resource referrals for small businesses and others so that they are able to do what they can to be able to return once permitted
- Partnered with the BID and the Sidgmore Family Foundation ("Foundation") to bring an innovative "Pay Half" program to our downtown. The program, funded entirely by the Foundation, selected Westbury's downtown to offer discounted meals for patrons to assist in driving business to our open food establishments and helping them stay afloat
- Worked with Westbury Arts to design a modified a Summer Arts Program
- Currently working with Westbury Arts for a modified concert series, maybe replacing the in-person concerts at the Piazza with several drive-in concerts – information to follow
- Participated in information dissemination with the Fire Department and Westbury School District about community impacts and resources
- Worked with our partners in government (state, county, town and local) to coordinate efforts and resources
- We've been constantly updating our residents through the use of mailings, almost daily Facebook posts, updates to our website, several 311 telephone calls and frequent email blasts. Residents who want the most up-to-date information should join our blast email list. If you have not already done so, please email your email address to [clerksoffice@villageofwestbury.org](mailto:clerksoffice@villageofwestbury.org), and we will add you to our distribution
- We have asked the Governor to allow our tax payments (due in June) to have an additional 21-day grace period before interest and penalties start – we are waiting for the Governor's response to that request

Unfortunately, we expect that a number of the usual Westbury summer activities (like feasts and other events) may be cancelled, but we will be working with many of our local organizations to facilitate events that are possible, so that the summer months continue to have actual and virtual activities of interest.

As the public health crisis continues, and eventually lifts, we ask that you continue to take note of all of the advisories issued by the State and other public health authorities, and observe all prudent advisories as to how to go about your personal business, including social distancing, wearing masks and gloves when out in public.

We are confident that once the cloud of Covid-19 lifts, we will be able to resume, in the years ahead, our positive community trajectory.

**We thank our doctors, nurses and other health workers, as well as our police, fire and safety personnel, our sanitation workers, our delivery men and women and our grocery workers, and everyone else who have worked tirelessly through this crisis to maintain our essential services and community.**
