

This afternoon program is open from Monday to Friday, 2:00 PM to 6:00 PM (except when Westbury Schools are closed for holidays, snow days, etc.). The after-school program provides a supervised place for the youth of our area to meet, get help with their homework; and enjoy the variety of recreation activities offered by the Village. # Safety Tips for the Winter Months

Many accidents happen in the home but most could be avoided if we take certain precautions. The following is a check list from the Nassau County Health Department - "Home Safe Home." Please take the time to go through your home with this checklist:

## In The Kitchen:

- ❑ Loose, flowing clothing is never worn during cooking.
- ❑ Extension cords and appliance cords are kept away from the sink and stove.
- ❑ Direct, even lighting is available over the stove, sink and counters - especially where food is sliced and cut.
- ❑ For reaching high shelves, there is a stable stepstool with a handrail to grasp.
- ❑ During cooking, pot handles are turned toward the back of the stove. Hot liquids (coffee cups!) are kept out of children's reach.
- ❑ Food treats or other items attractive to children are not kept over the stove.
- ❑ Knives and sharp objects are kept out of children's reach.
- ❑ Cleaning supplies are stored separately from food; kept beyond children's reach, or in cabinets secured with child safety latches or locks.
- ❑ Child's high chair is stable, with a wide base and a tray that locks securely.

## In The Bedroom:

- ❑ Lamps or light switches are within reach of each bed.
- ❑ Fire sources, such as ash trays, smoking materials, heaters, hot plates, tea pots, etc. are kept well away from beds and bedding.
- ❑ No one in the house *ever* smokes in bed!
- ❑ Electric blankets are not covered or folded. ("Tucking in" an electric blanket can cause heat buildup and start a fire.)
- ❑ There is a telephone next to the bed.

## In The Bathroom:

- ❑ Bathtubs and showers are equipped with grab bars.
- ❑ Bathtubs and showers are equipped with non-skid mats.
- ❑ Hot temperature is set at 110-120 degrees F or lower.
- ❑ A light switch is located near the entrance to the bathroom.
- ❑ Small electrical appliances, such as hair dryers, shavers, curling irons or radios are never used near water in sinks or tubs and are unplugged when not in use.
- ❑ All medicines are clearly marked and stored in the containers they came in.
- ❑ All medicine bottles have child-resistance caps.
- ❑ Medicines and vitamins are stored beyond children's reach and are disposed of properly when outdated.
- ❑ When bathing, children are always watched by an adult.
- ❑ Young children are never left alone in the bathroom.

# Snow Emergency Rules

With winter weather fast approaching, please note the Village's snow emergency rules and procedures:

- A snow emergency will automatically exist when snow accumulation exceeds 4.5 inches in depth. When snow reaches that depth, all motor vehicle operators are presumed, by law, to know that a snow emergency exists, and that snow emergency procedures are in place.
- Snow emergencies may be declared by the Mayor, or Deputy Mayors in the Mayor's absence, or under other circumstances deemed appropriate.
- Snow emergencies will last for 72 hours, unless sooner terminated.
- A number of major Village streets have been designated as "snow emergency routes" so that they will receive priority plowing. No vehicles may be parked on a snow emergency route during a snow emergency. This will enable us to ensure that these major roads stay open for motorists, as well as fire and emergency personnel. A list of snow emergency streets can be obtained by calling the Village Department of Public Works (334-0062) or at [www.villageofwestbury.org](http://www.villageofwestbury.org).
- The Mayor, or Deputy Mayors in the Mayor's absence, may implement such other measures deemed appropriate to respond to a snow emergency.



Village law requires the removal of all automobiles from Village streets during a 24-hour period after a "snow emergency" is declared to facilitate snow plowing.

A full description of our snow emergency parking rules can be found in Village Code sections 237-57 & 59 (available on our website: [www.villageofwestbury.org](http://www.villageofwestbury.org), *Village Code Section*)

Residents are also reminded that, following a snowstorm, they are required to clear the sidewalks in front of their homes soon after a storm ends. Businesses are also required to clear snow from the front of their stores. Residents who live on corners or other areas where there are handicap ramps or fire hydrants should also clear these areas of snow and ice as well. Residents are also encouraged to assist elderly or disabled neighbors during snow emergencies.

While the Village has the authority to tow cars that are illegally parked during snow emergencies, it is preferred that residents voluntarily comply with these rules. But, in cases where it is necessary to do so, the Village will have cars towed to facilitate plowing and traffic flow.

Finally, landlords are required to allow tenants to park in available driveways, and may not require that tenants park on streets.

By following these rules, residents can assist the Village in dealing with snow emergencies in the best and most expedient manner.
